FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is districting?

Districting is the process of transitioning from an at-large to a by-district election system. A by-district election system is one where Hayward is divided into electoral districts. Each district elects one City Council member who lives there and is chosen by the voters in that district.

Why should I get involved in the districting process?

We would like to hear from you so we can make informed decisions about where to draw the new district lines. Specifically, we need information from you about your neighborhoods and communities of interest. If we know the geographic locations of the communities of interest, we can consider them when drawing lines, and try to avoid splitting them! Keeping communities together in the same district can help to get more responsive representation.

How can I get involved?

The general public is encouraged to participate in the process by attending public hearings, providing public comment (in writing or live), feedback on communities of interest and submitting draft maps.
